North Carolina: THADE has had an interesting year to put it lightly. The COVID-19 pandemic has pushed most of us here at NCDDS into a teleworking environment and unfamiliar territory. While there have been many new obstacles THADE has managed to keep in touch with each other through it all. While we look forward to more stability, I would like to take this time to tell you about our past year.

Last October our Employee Appreciation Week Committee hosted a virtual Employee Appreciation Week for NCDDS. The theme was a movie theme displaying how well we remembered both old and new movies alike. The committee held daily trivia and had a movie recreation challenge where the objective was to recreate a famous movie scene, movie poster, or iconic movie character/cast using household items. The committee held a Zoom call for anyone who wanted to come together and socialize with coworkers. The final activity for the week was a door decoration challenge where participants decorated one door in their house based on their favorite movie. While this employee appreciation week was far different from those of the past, everyone had a wonderful time.

Our Membership committee has continued to reach out to everyone at NCDDS and encourage them to become part of THADE. We were able to recruit a handful of new members this past January during our annual membership drive. As of today, we have 57 current members of THADE. We continue to meet with each new training class in effort to recruit new members into the organization. We hope to continue to grow our numbers into the 2021-2022 year.

One of our favorite times is April because of Organ Donation Awareness Month. Our Organ Donation Committee does a fantabulous job raising awareness. Throughout the month, they held informative sessions where others could learn about organ donation. For each week, they covered a different topic. From learning about types of donors and donations to myths and misconceptions about organ donation to learning about the process of organ donation. During the final week, the topic was an article about how a young boy who "always wanted to be a Super Hero" was able to save the lives of at least seven other children through organ donation. The committee also held a virtual bingo game and staff members of NCDDS submitted photos of their blue and green ensembles in support of organ donation.

In June, our NDPW committee put on a fantastic National Disability Professionals Week for the organization. The theme was "Back to the 80's" and to focus on the NADE them of "Hit me with your best shot" the committee focused on medical issues and breakthroughs of the 1980's as well as other aspects of the 80's that filled our hearts with neon. The committee hosted trivia, a virtual scavenger hunt, one at home and one at the worksite, held a virtual 80's trivia game, which included trivia categories of music, TV, movies, sports, fads, and technology. On Thursday, the committee virtually hosted NADE President Marjorie Garcia where she gave updates on NADE and the committee introduced our new THADE officers. That Friday members joined at NCDDS

in the courtyard for a hot dog lunch. This was a great opportunity for members to come together and see each other outside for some good food and great conversation.

PERC: Our PERC committee received nominations for national awards in two categories. Detailed nominations were prepared by the Committee and forwarded to the national awards chairperson.

All things said I am extremely proud of the work THADE has done in the past year in the face of such adversity. We are looking forward to bigger and brighter days ahead!

South Carolina: Unfortunately, we were not able to do a lot over the past year as SCDDS had a majority of the staff teleworking during the pandemic. Ebony Grissett (Chapter President) meet with the new training class in September 2020 to speak with them about SCADE and NADE and the benefits of joining the organization.
