Subject: NADE Great Plains Regional Director's 2021 Midyear Report

Since the Midyear Board meeting in 2020 in Baltimore, Maryland, NADE activities have significantly declined due to COVID-19. I was able to keep in communication with my region as per my charges as Regional Director.

Here are the highlights of the Great Plains Chapters' activities.

<u>Colorado</u>

CADE has been having monthly teleconference meetings since October 2020. They are focusing on adapting our meetings/activities to the teleworking environment and encouraging involvement in CADE/NADE.

CADE organized a donation drive for the Salvation Army Adopt-a-family program in December 2020 resulting in an approximate value of \$2240.00 donated gifts being given to a family of 6. They also organized a toy drive for the Toys for Tots program resulting in approximately 60 toys being donated.

CADE held a New Membership Virtual Coffee Break in late January in addition to emailing a newsletter with information regarding CADE/NADE and reasons that current members joined CADE/NADE. Current members answered any questions from the DDS staff regarding CADE/NADE during the coffee break. This resulted in 4 new members joining. CADE, in conjunction with DDS, organized a virtual Lunch and Learn for all DDS staff in February by inviting a speaker to discuss Dementia & Disability: Understanding the Intersection of Neurological Disorders and the Disability Adjudication Process.

They have the following plans for the future: Continuing bimonthly Lunch and Learns for DDS staff Participating in Monthly Moral Boosters with DDS staff starting in May 2021 Sending out Quarterly Newsletters to DDS staff w/CADE updates
